

General Rules To be read on conjunction with the Club Constitution

COVID-19

Direction is taken from Bowls Victoria regarding COVID-19 restriction to bowls competition and facility.

Club Colours

The colours of the Club shall be as the Committee from time to time determines, subject to approval or rejection by the Royal Victorian Bowling Association or any other Association covering the activities of the Club

Supply of Liquor

Supply of liquor will be in accordance with the Inverleigh Bowls Club Liquor Licence and according to Responsible Serving of Alcohol policies.

Damage to Property

No Member shall remove from Club premises or deface or injure any article of Club property. Members so doing shall pay restitution as fixed by a meeting of the Executive Committee

Alteration to Rules

The Executive Committee may make, alter, amend or rescind rules as occasions may require. Changes to rules will be advised to Members.

Interpretation of Rules

In the event of any doubt or difficulty arising as to the meaning of any rule, law or regulation, or should any question arise as to their interpretation, the Executive Committee shall have the power to pronounce a decision thereon and its decision shall be final and binding on the Members, subject only to affirmation or reversal by a Special General Meeting called for that purpose.

Disputes, suggestions, complaints, breaches of the Code of Conduct etc

- All suggestions and complaints must be made in writing to the President who will raise the issue at the next Executive (or General) Committee meeting.
- Should any dispute or disagreement arise between Members, this must be sent in writing to the president or secretary for consideration.
- Breaches of the Code of Conduct should be reported to a member of the IBC Executive Committee in writing and will be resolved calmly, with honesty, dignity and in confidence.
- Where and when required the IBC Executive Committee will investigate, discuss and action the breach in accordance with the Club's Constitution.
- The IBC Executive Committee reserves the right to make decisions and enforce fair and appropriate measures to resolve a Code of Conduct breach
- Written and verbal feedback will be provided to the reporter to indicate actions taken to address the issue.
